

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-09

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND TITLE 17, CHAPTER 1,
SECTION 17-110 REFUSE AND TRASH COLLECTION OF THE
SPRING CITY MUNICIPAL CODE**

WHEREAS, on September 5, 2019, the Town of Spring City (the "Town") entered into a contract with Waste Connections of Tennessee to provide refuse and trash collection and disposal for residents within its corporate city limits; and

WHEREAS, the Town currently charges \$14.62 per customer for refuse and trash collection, where \$14.62 of that total is paid to Waste Connections of Tennessee and \$.45 is kept for administrative costs; and

WHEREAS, each year, Waste Connections of Tennessee re-evaluates their rate charged in accordance with Section 13.00 "Basis and Method of Payment" of the contract; and

WHEREAS, Waste Connections of Tennessee has not increased their rate from 2019 to 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Town received notice from Waste Connections of Tennessee that, in accordance with Section 13.02 "Modification to Rates" of the contract, they will be increasing our rate from \$14.62 to \$14.96 per customer; and

WHEREAS, given the rate increase, the Town will need to increase the monthly charge from \$14.96 to \$15.41 to account for the rate increase as well as the \$.45 administrative costs; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Spring City that Title 17, Chapter 1, Section 17-110: Refuse Collection Fees of the Spring City Municipal Code is hereby amended and revised to state as follows:

SECTION 1: 17-110 Refuse Collection Fees.

(1) Residential. The cost of residential refuse collection shall be as follows:

(a) Based on one (1) pick-up per week the cost will be fifteen dollars and forty-one cents (\$15.41) per month.

(2) Commercial (non-dumpster). The cost of commercial refuse collection shall be as follows:


(a) Based on one (1) pick-up per week the cost will be fifteen dollars and forty-one cents (\$15.41) per month.


SECTION 2: This ordinance shall become effective upon final passage, the public welfare requiring it.
